National Prescription Drug Take Back Day is Coming Up on October 26

SOUTH CENTRAL IDAHO – On Saturday, October 26, South Central Public Health District (SCPHD) is partnering with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and community partners all over the health district to host a local Drug Take Back Day collection event from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the following locations:

In 2023, over 2.5 million controlled substance prescriptions were dispensed in Idaho state alone. When left in a medicine cabinet, thrown away or flushed, unused prescriptions can be dangerous to people, animals, or the environment. Last year, deadly overdoses in Idaho hit a state record of 386 lives lost. Drug disposal is one of the most effective ways to prevent potential prescription misuse and/or overdose. Eli Thompson states, "It only takes a few minutes to help protect those you care about by disposing of unused prescriptions."

All prescription drugs will be accepted, as well as over-the-counter medications, vitamins, and veterinary medications. Take Back drop-off locations will also accept vape pens, cartridges, or other e-cigarette devices (without the batteries in the device). **Needles will not be accepted.**

Help keep our community safe and healthy by dropping off your old medication on Saturday, October 26.
